<u>On the Outside</u>

Saving rain water saves money and helps the Environment - Approximately 40% of water used in summer is used outdoors which is when most areas face water shortages and have water restrictions. This water shortage period is when plants and trees require water the most.

With gutters and downspouts on your house or garage, you have a great system for harvesting clear rainwater for the garden and help you save money.

Here is a list of materials, tools and instructions to get you started.

Materials:

1-30 to 55 gal. Barrel or garbage can 1-"S" shaped aluminum downspout elbow

4– concrete blocks

	1– Piece of aluminum window screen
Special Points of	1-standard 1" hose spigot with 3/4"

Tools:

Hacksaw, Screwdriver, pop rivet gun with rivets, drill, pencil, ruler, shovel, level and adjustable open end wrench.

Scrub the inside of your container with soap and water to remove any residue.

Level the area for your barrel & set concrete blocks in place & level them. Measure where the downspout elbow will come out from the side of the house & direct water into the barrel, position the barrel in place. Hold the new elbow above the barrel & mark where the elbow will join the downspout (1" above the barrel is best).

Set barrel & elbow aside & measure down 2" from the mark in the downspout. This will allow the downspout to fit into the elbow with a good, solid connection. Use the hacksaw to cut the downspout, then fit the elbow on & fasten it with sheet metal screws or pop rivets.

Avoid auto Repair Scams

National figures indicate Americans spend more than \$20 billion a year on faulty or unnecessary auto repairs. Older Americans are often targeted because they are perceived as having more money. They also tend to be more concerned than younger drivers about issues of safety and liability.

If this sounds familiar, here's some guidance for avoiding future problems.

Ask friends for names of a reliable mechanic. Once there, find out weather or not the shop gives a written estimate or completion date for the repair. Also, if the shop refuses to warranty the work or fails to offer a satisfaction guarantee, that's a shop to steer away from.

So, what are some common repair scams to watch for?

<u>Automatic transmission</u>

Poor transmission performance doesn't always mean a transmission repair. It could be as simple as a disconnected hose or plugged filter. Beware if you've got trouble shifting and the mechanic says he'll have to tear down the transmission to find the cause. The next step is to rebuild it for several hundred dollars. You bite on an advertised "brake special" for about 50 bucks, but once the mechanic takes a look, he says you'll need a complete brake job for about 500 bucks. With "low cost" specials, there's usually more than meets the eye. Establishing a practice of routine maintenance— involving fluids, filters, brakes and tires-helps keep you out of the repair shop. But when you must go in, look for the good business practices you expect from any service industry (kind of like you expect from us!), and don't settle for anything less.

Flexible Gas Connectors

WASHINGTON, DC - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) is warning consumers about dangerous, older flexible gas connectors used to connect home appliances to gas supply pipes. These gas connectors are made of brass, are uncoated, and can crack or break, leading to a fire or explosion. They are used most often with gas ranges, ovens and clothes

dryers.

Only a licensed service technician should check these gas connectors and replace them if necessary. CPSC warns that consumers should not check the gas connectors themselves. Moving an older appliance, even slightly, can cause the connectors to crack and result in a gas leak and explosion.

This type of gas connector has not been manufactured for about 20 years, but some still exist in consumers' homes. The older these connectors get, the more dangerous they become.

The brass fittings on these gas connectors, which connect the gas supply to the appliance, were soldered onto a corrugated brass tube. The CPSC believes the solder can fail, causing a break in the connector resulting in a gas leak.

Consumers with older gas appliances should immediately call DuAll Heating & Cooling at (630) 247-1720 to replace their gas connectors if necessary.

Ouch!

Not all bumps make a bruise, but some do, and most bruises go away without treatment. Still, bruising can sometimes be a sign of a more serious problem.

Most bruises form when small blood vessels (capillaries) near your skin's surface are broken by the impact of a blow or injury. When this happens, blood leaks out of the vessels and initially appears as a bright or dark red, purple or black mark. Eventually your body reabsorbs the blood, and the mark usually disappears.

Several factors may contribute to bruising, including:

• Aging capillaries. Over time, the tissues supporting these vessels weaken, and capillary walls become

more fragile and prone to rupture.

- Thinning skin. With age, your skin becomes thinner and loses some of the protective fatty layer that helps cushion your blood vessels against injury. Excessive exposure to the sun accelerates the aging process in the skin.
- Blood-thinning drugs such as aspirin and warfarin

 Certain dietary supplements such as fish oil and ginkgo also may increase your bruising risk

Generally, the harder the blow, the larger the bruise. However, if you bruise easily, a minor bump - one you may not even notice - can result in substantial discoloration. Your arms and legs are typical locations for bruises. Once a bruise has formed, not much can be done to treat it. Most eventually disappear as your body reabsorbs the blood. If swelling is associated with the bruising, applying a cold compress for 20



minutes at a time and elevating the affected area may help. After the swelling has gone down, a warm compress may speed removal of the blood.

To prevent minor bruising, eliminate household

clutter that could cause bumps or falls. Long-sleeved shirts and pants may provide an extra layer of protection for your skin. Avoid prolonged exposure to the sun to help you avoid its aging effects and the increased bruising risk that may result.

Drill a 3/4-inch hole in the wall of the barrel. Make it high enough to put a bucket underneath. Squeeze caulk around the hole on both sides. Next, connect the spigot and coupling, and wrap Teflon tape on each of the threaded ends for a tight seal. Slip on a washer and insert the threaded end of the coupling through the hole from the outside. On the inside, put a washer over the pipe and fasten everything together with the bushing.

A couple of inches down from the top of the barrel, drill another 3/4-inch hole. Then build the overflow assembly. Squeeze caulk around the hole inside and out and place a washer on the hose adapter. Push this assembly through the hole. Slip a washer and Teflon tape on the inside threads and tighten everything together with a nut. When you connect a length of garden hose to this overflow valve, you can direct some of the overflow into the garden after a heavy rain.

If your barrel has a lid, cut a hole where the new downspout elbow will direct water into it. Cover the hole with a piece of screen to keep mosquitoes out.

Finally, set the barrel back on the concrete blocks, make sure the downspout will di-<u>crect</u> water into it properly, and wait for the rain.
